Disclosure of Graduation and Transfer-out Rates

The information contained in this disclosure document is provided by Enterprise-Ozark Community College in compliance with the Student-Right-to-Know Act of 1990 (Title I of Public Law 101-542)

It is the policy of Enterprise-Ozark Community College to:

- ◇ disseminate to all current and prospective students information regarding the institution's graduation or completion rate of full-time degree/certificate-seeking students who have enrolled for the first time, and who have not previously enrolled at any other institution of higher learning;
- ◇ provide information regarding the College's graduation or completion rate to prospective students before they enroll or enter into any financial obligation at the institution related to the student's proposed program of study. The College shall disclose its rate by July 1, 2004, and by July 1 of each year thereafter;
- ◇ disseminate to enrolled and prospective students information concerning student financial assistance available to students enrolled at the institution;
- ◇ calculate its graduation or completion rate by following the progress of each first-time, full-time student entering each fall from the time of enrollment through the period equal to 150% of the normal time for graduation or completion from the student's program;
- ◇ count as the projected graduation or completion rate of the College's 2004 entering student cohort, the percentage of all students in that group who have either completed or graduated from that particular program, re-enrolled for fall of the following year, or transferred to a higher level program, and;
- ◇ exclude from the calculation of the graduation /completion rate students who leave college to serve in the Armed Services, go on an official church mission assignment, serve with a foreign aid service of the Federal Government, or become deceased.

GRADUATION/COMPLETION AND KNOWN TRANSFER-OUT RATES

The graduation/completion rate for students enrolling as first-time, full-time students at Enterprise-Ozark Community College for the Fall Term of 2004 is 17%. This figure includes students who graduated from the College within 150% of normal time of completion.

The known transfer-out rate for students enrolling as first-time, full-time students for the Fall Term of 2004 is 41%. This figure includes students who transferred out within 150% of normal time of completion.

Disclosure requirements do not include part-time and transient students; however, these groups reflect much of the College's total student enrollment.

DISCLOSURES REGARDING STUDENT ATHLETES

Each July 1, when the College offers a potential student athlete athletically-related student aid, the institution shall disclose to the potential athlete and his or her parents, high school coach, and guidance counselor the following data categorized by race and sex:

- ◇ the number of full-time, first-time degree/certificate-seeking students enrolled during the preceding fall;
- ◇ the number of students who received athletically-related aid, categorized by sport; and,
- ◇ the graduation or completion rate for each sport categorized by race and sex.

In 2004, the College's athletic program consisted of men's and women's basketball, women's softball, and men's baseball.
